Featured Announcement #2

Spotted Lantern Bugs (SLB) - this is a follow up from last fall's article by Sarah Omietanski

Have you too seen these pesky destructive insects all over your garden?! The SLB live for one year. They lay eggs in late fall that hatch in the spring. Eggs are laid on hard surfaces like trees, decks, houses, underside of cars, and rocks. Do your part and scrape eggs into an alcohol bag to kill them, band trees with sticky tape to trap the nymphs, remove any Tree of Heaven trees from your yard and apply insecticides in the spring to kill the adults.

- ✓ Follow CDC guidelines.



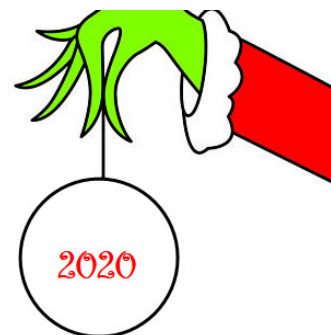
Thanksgiving Safety during COVID-19

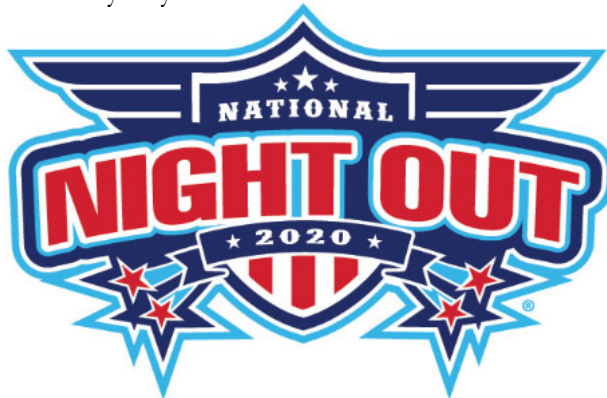
