A message from Chief of Police, John Baran:



In Pennsylvania, it is illegal to operate a dirt bike or ATV on any roadway in Pennsylvania unless it is registered and insured, similar to a motor vehicle. These recreational vehicles can be operated on private property with permission from the property owner or on state designated trails. **There are no such areas in Hulmeville.**

Violations of these laws could result in fines, license suspensions and/or the ATV or quad being impounded..

CODE ENFORCEMENT

- The Fire Marshal is responsible for the Borough fire code, fire inspections and code enforcement. You can contact Bill Wheeler at fire_marshall@hulmeville-pa.gov to get your needed permits.
- Do you have a fire pit? Anyone with a fire pit needs a yearly permit: Contact the Fire Marshall to acquire the permit

WATER METER REPLACEMENT PROJECT

The Authority is in the process of replacing old water meters in the borough. We replaced approximately half of the old meters earlier this year. Another round of replacements will take place, probably in August. We have purchased the new meters from Rio, who have subcontracted the replacement work to Lenegan Plumbing. If you are contacted by the Lenegan, or the Borough Authority, to schedule the replacement of your meter, **DO NOT IGNORE THIS NOTICE**. Lenegan will replace your meter in approximately 15 minutes at no cost to you. If you do not allow

the replacement, your water service may be terminated until you contract with a plumber to replace your meter, at your cost. Watch for a notice from Lenegan to schedule your replacement.

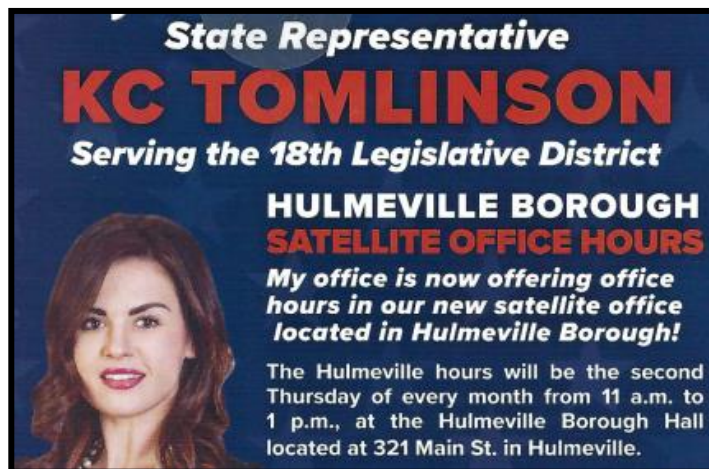

What You Can Bring

Up to 25 gallons or 220 pounds of hazardous products. Hazardous products will have cautionary words on the label, for example: *Danger, Warning, or Caution*. Other words or phrases that can signal hazardous products include: *poisonous, hazardous, combustible, flammable, corrosive, volatile, caustic, irritant, explosive, toxic, use with adequate ventilation, or avoid inhaling*.

Why bring your household hazardous wastes to a scheduled event?

Household products containing toxic chemicals, like pesticides, oil-based paints, solvents, cleaning products, weed killers and automotive batteries can be a threat to people and the environment if improperly discarded. Never throw these materials into the trash, as the toxic chemicals may harm sanitation workers, or result in fires in collection vehicles. It is also not safe to pour them into a sink or storm drain as they can end up in the environment polluting the air, water, or soil.
